The four best successful pedagogies identified by Kundu and Bej (2021) in the New Normal environment are:

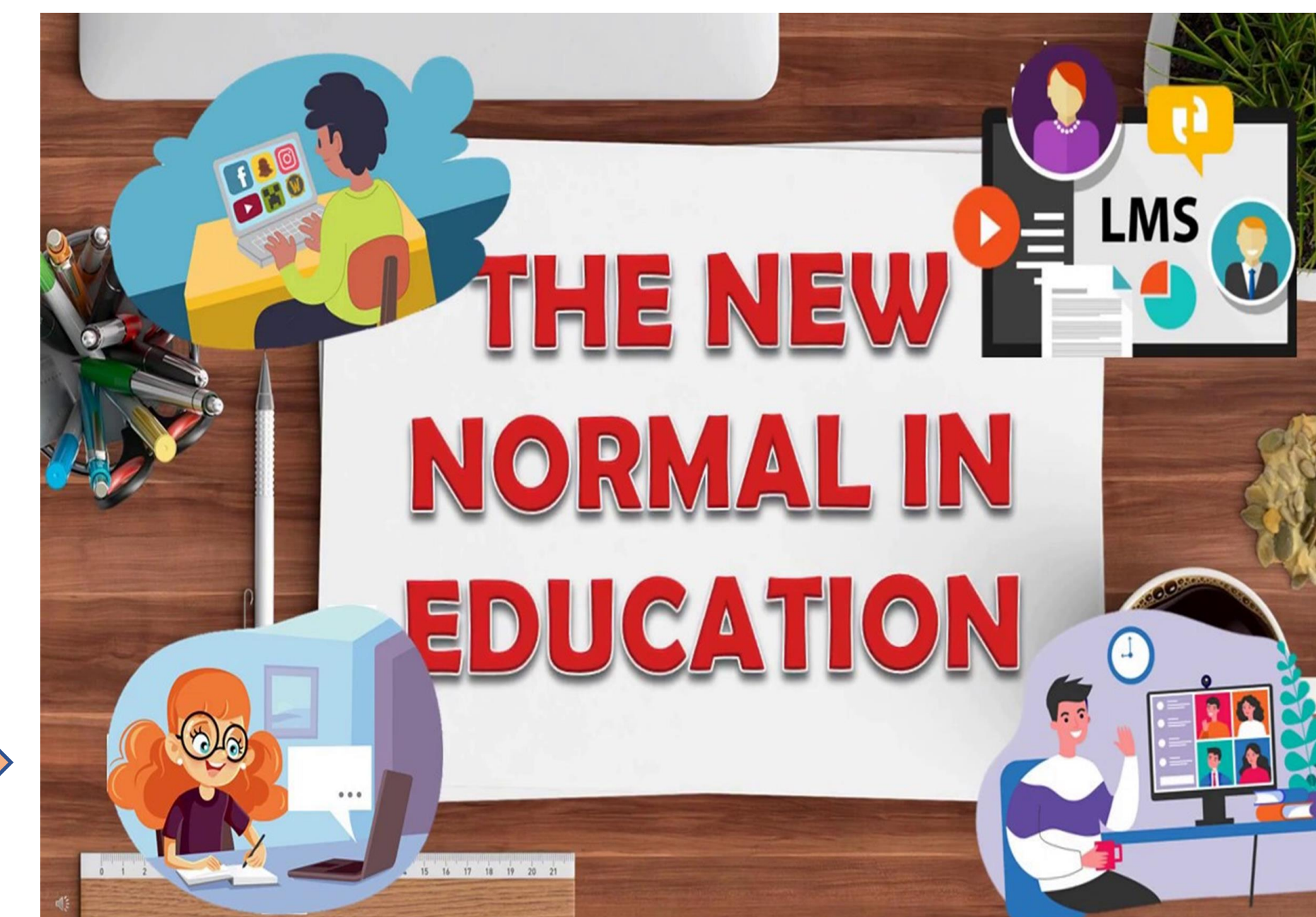
- **Project-based Learning**

2.1 : Implementation: Gadgets and Internet



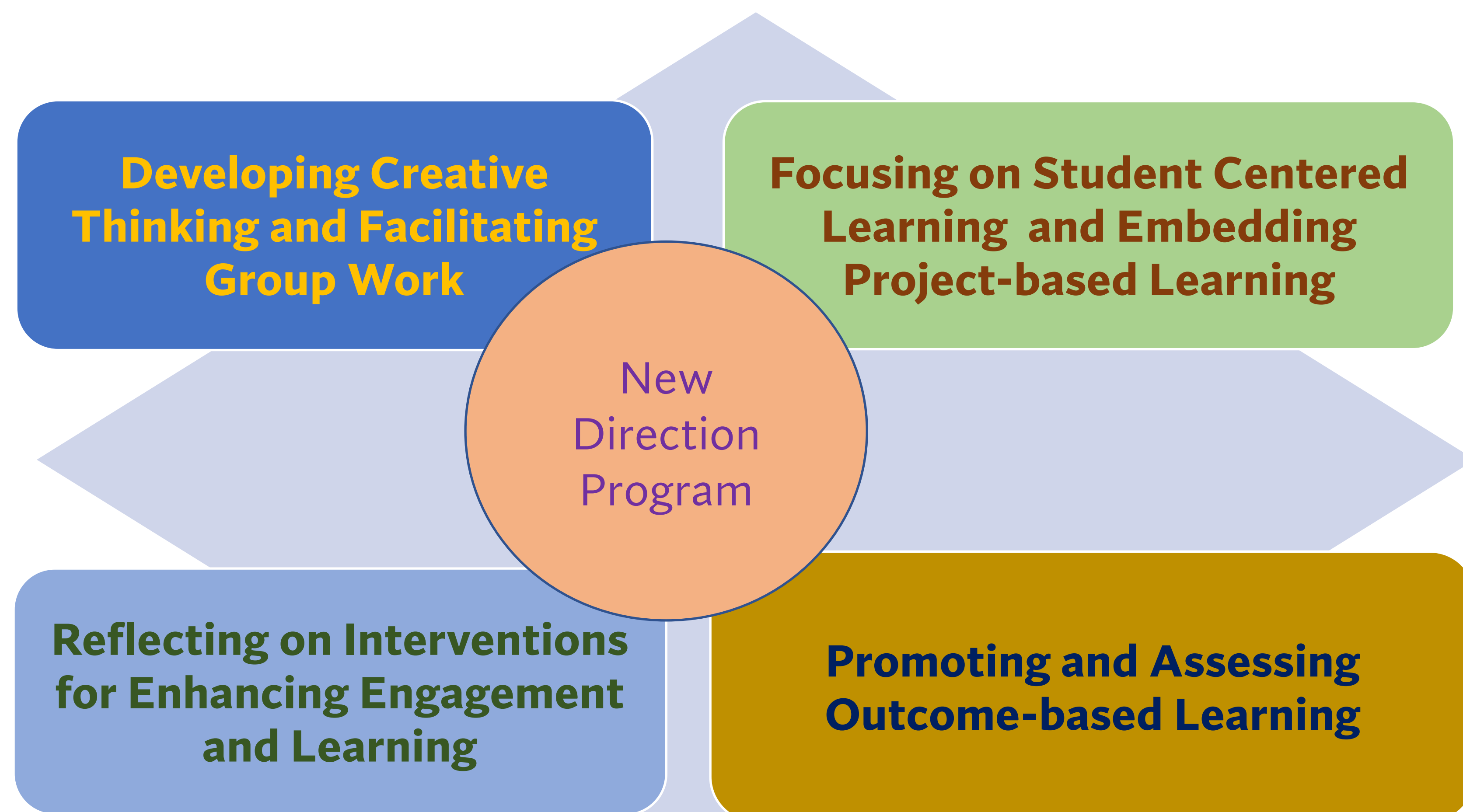
- The distance between the teacher and student does not make the educational process less real.
